2010 was a big year for BMXV, which allowed us to invest in infrastructure to secure and improve the future of our sport. Having the Nationals in Victoria gave us the opportunity to run additional race meetings in Shepparton, giving riders time on the Nationals track, and us surplus funds to invest.

Some of this went in the affiliation costs with Cycling Victoria, and in the future will grow our sport through additional grants, professional administration and a comprehensive schools program.

We have also invested in equipment to run our major race meetings, including a transponder system and fully functional Points Café. Not only will these make the State Championships easier to run, but Open meetings will benefit too.

We have continued to support the clubs with the 3 Rid Permits, giving something back to clubs and riders. We encourage all clubs to continue to use these with new members especially as the schools program riders increases our new rider numbers over the coming years.

We have also been able to provide one the nations largest prize pools for the Vic State Titles, which cements its position as the second largest race meeting in the country (Behind the National Titles).

Finally, we continue to invest in our State Team, with the aim of having a Victorian Rider represent Australia at the Olympics. This can only be done with professional coaching and an organisation to scout young talent and assist their development.

BMX Victoria Registrars Report for AGM, May 2011

At present we have 853 licensed riders in Victoria which is fantastic a far cry from several years ago. The numbers keep increasing each year.

BMXA currently processes new and renewing licences as soon as they arrive. At the end of that week the membership cards are produced and sent out to be received in your mail box .If you haven't received your card within 3 weeks please contact your club registrar or BMXA to chase up

By the end of the year BMXA is encouraging all States to get their membership / licensing procedures all using the BMXA ON-LINE membership system. This will save time for all Club Registrars and make collecting of fees for Clubs and States much quicker and easier. This process is currently happening in a number of States already and is being received favourably by all who are using it.

BMX Victoria race numbers are allocated regularly. Club Registrars please inform all new members that they need to check the BMXV web site under Administration for their newly allocated race number. All new members need to ride on their BMXVIC allocated race number at each race meeting, so that there is no confusion when your race results are scored.

Clubs are sent a current Club expiry listing when new and renewing riders have been processed by BMXA Yellow slips need to be sent in to me ASAP, so that I can manually check data on the processed lists that I get from BMXA and update the BMXV database accurately.

Coaching Director's report

2010/11 Achievements:

June 2010:

Rob Symmons attended a combined weekend at Cycling Australia in Mascot which included the following:

- Presenter and Assessor training specific to Cycling Australia Coach Education.
- Coach Educators Conference.
- Orientation to present CycleSkills Coach Training.

Rob is now qualified to present CycleSkills course (1st course to be supervised as co-presenter).

March 2011:

Rob Symmons travelled to Adelaide to attend Orientation to present Level 1 Day 1 BMX Coach Training.

Rob is now qualified to present Day 1 of BMX Coach Training - Sport Specific day (1st course to be supervised as co-presenter.).

A Level 1 BMX Coach Training weekend has been booked for May 21/22, with Rob co-presenting Day 1, and Sharon Willoughby presenting Day 2. A week out, there are 6 confirmed bookings, and several other strong intentions. Rob is expecting between 12 and 16 participants to attend. Interest in this course was strong, and it is hoped with more notice, some of the interested parties not able to commit to the May 21/22 weekend may be available later in the year. With 12 participants at \$260, the course is expected to break even financially. The expenses are mostly to cover interstate presenter and associated travel and accommodation expenses.

Planning is underway for a 2nd running of this course later in the year. The anticipated weekends are Nov 12/13 or 26/27, with the former being the preferred option.

Goals for 2011/2012:

- Rob to orient and qualify to present Day 2 (General Sport Science).
- Present at least one Level 1 Coaching course per year, and have at least one accredited Level 1 Coach in every club. Obviously, this will require the support of the clubs.
- Arrange a level 2 course, preferably in Victoria.

Cycling Australia have a strong intent to have the courses presented over two consecutive days, with 2 presenters. Currently there is only one presenter in Victoria for Day 2. This makes the logistics of the course a little more challenging, but we are fostering relationships with interstate presenters to enable the scheduling of courses.

Cycling Australia are reviewing the pathway for Coach education. With the limitations of CycleSkills Coaches not being qualified or allowed to coach unsupervised on a BMX track, alternate options are being reviewed. For this reason, we have chosen not to present a CycleSkills course targeted at BMX coaches. The BMXV Coaching Development team will continue to respond to these changes.

In the short term, the Beginning Coaching Principles (BCP) online course has been approved as an alternate to CycleSkills as a pre-requisite. (Most of the May21st /22nd participants have qualified via this alternate path.)

It is expected that the future path will be similar, with an online course similar to BCP.
